<u>From the Pastor's Desk</u> 👘

KEEP THIS SECRET

"PSSSST! Hey, can you keep a secret?" It's a really important secret. One that we cannot - or should not - ignore. I know you've been disappointed in secrets before. Buying the new, improved product that now contains a 'secret ingredient' only to realize it is the same ol' product and the only new 'secret ingredient' is the 20 percent markup in the cost of the product. Or how about those many ads that advertise the 'secret' of losing the weight that you've gained during the pandemic (been there, done that, and got the extra-large Tshirt!). I understand because, like you, I too have been disappointed in these so-called 'secrets.' But, we really need to hear this secret especially now - Now that we are dealing with another round of COVID. We must hear this secret after a year and a half of wearing masks, keeping our distance, of having our hopes rise and then dashed time and time again. We need to hear this secret because

there is a lot of discouraging news and circumstances that we face on a daily basis. OK, you've had enough of me whipping up the anticipation. "Just get it out, Kevin, what is this huge, life-changing secret that we can't live without?" It is found in Philippians 4:11-13:

¹¹ Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. ¹² I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the **secret** of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. ¹³ I can do all things through him who strengthens me.

Maybe this is not a new 'secret' to you. Perhaps you are a little disappointed that this is all I've got for you after such a prolonged buildup. Every Christian knows this passage; and in fact, many of us have a picture or a plaque hanging up in our homes that quotes Philippians 4:13. But I know that we all have a tendency to overlook the very things that are right in front of our noses (like pictures and plaques that hang in our homes). I need to hear this secret again, because after a year and a half of COVID and the seesaw of the imposition of and lifting of and then the reimposition of restrictions, I start to develop a bad attitude, and I am tempted to cause a big scene - a 'stompin' my feet and screamin' at the top of my lungs kind of temper tantrum that would rival anything that a 'terrible twos' toddler could generate. Things were just beginning to look up again. Fewer cases of COVID were being reported. Better attendance in worship. Activities were starting up again. You could eat indoors, and masks were no longer required. During the summer, our Vision Team has been preparing a "Welcome Back to Church" Sunday with a celebration meal and testimonies of God's faithfulness. And then - BOOM things seemed to go backwards overnight. Once again, our plans are postponed, and we are disappointed.

Blessing Bag Outreach Returns!

What is a Blessing Bag? Blessing Bags are gallon-size Ziploc[®] bags that contain items that people who are experiencing difficult circumstances or are homeless find useful.

Why have Blessing Bags? They are a way to demonstrate God's Love for others by the act of giving in the face of a need instead of just driving by or walking away without responding. The bags we put together can be kept in your car, so when you encounter a person who is experiencing homelessness, you can offer the Blessing Bag. Some Blessing Bags will also be kept in the church office, so when someone comes in who needs help, we can offer them a bag.

How can you help? We will be collecting items to fill the Blessing Bags. The list below will help you know what things are most needed. It is important to remember that the items need to fit in a gallon-size Ziploc® bag. There will be a collection box in the Narthex in September, and we will be begin assembling the Blessing Bags in October for fall and winter giving. The Membership Care Committee will be using some funds (you can donate for this, too!) to purchase additional items needed along with devotional booklets and notes of encouragement.

We look forward to beginning this beautiful way of reaching out and blessing others. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact anyone on the Membership Care Committee.

From her June 2021 Letter...

Happy is the one who reads this book, and happy are those who listen to the words of this prophetic message and obey what is written in this book! For the time is near when all these things will happen. (Rev. 1:3 TEV)

SIM's Tom Fifield took a photo of "The Bible in Kafa Hands." That has been our goal for many years, and it happened on May 22! Tom Fifield drove several of us to the Dedication of the Kafa Bible. We enjoyed the view of forest-covered mountains and green valleys along the way. The Dedication was held in the new cultural center in Bonga. There were many speeches and testimonies. I felt that the Holy Spirit orchestrated all that was said to emphasize the value of this newly published Bible for the Kafa people. A lady and two boys read from the Kafa Bible to demonstrate that it is for everyone, not grown for men. They handed out certificates of appreciation to various people who had been involved in the translation effort, including Ruth Cremer, who had overseen the translation of the New Testament, and Gezahegn, who had worked on the Old Testament until cancer took his life in 2014.

After the Dedication, the Bibles were on sale at a subsidized price (about \$3 each). I don't know yet how many Bibles had been brought, but all of them sold out within a few minutes. A pick-up truck was sent to bring more. The truck never made it inside the gate, but was stormed by the crowd, and every Bible it had brought also sold. The people were saying, "Why did you only print 10,000? That isn't nearly enough for all of us!" Tom said it looked like a famine-relief truck being stormed by hungry people. In a spiritual sense, I think it was. Praise God!

Matt had worked very hard to get the audio recording of the Kafa Bible synchronized with the written text. He made several Apps, which were put on micro-SD cards that can be inserted into smart phones. These were also available in limited quantities and will help people become fluent readers. They can also just listen to the audio recording.

- Safe travel for all of us who attended the Dedication
