From the Pastor's Desk

My tears have been my food day and night, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" Psalm 42:3 (ESV)

WHERE IS OUR GOD?

Since I first heard of the mass murders of school children and teachers at the school in Uvalde, TX, I, like all of you, have been filled with grief and sorrow for the families, a community, and a nation that has suffered such great pain. In the last few days, a verse from a Christmas hymn has been going through my mind:

And in despair I bowed my head: "There is no peace on earth," I said, "For hate is strong, and mocks the song

Of peace on earth, good will to men."

That line speaks of the despair we often feel when we face situations in which evil seems to prevail. I reached back into my files to see what I wrote in the days following 9/11 – another day that evoked a sense of great despair in the minds and hearts of many people.

"Where was your God on September 11th?" One of our members forwarded to me an article found on the internet, and the article begins with this question. Maybe you've heard this question in the past few months, or perhaps you've even asked this question yourself. While I don't agree with all the theology found in this article, I found that some of the author's points are well made. I will share some excerpts:

"...I know where my God was the morning of September 11, 2001...only around 20,000 workers were at the towers when the first jet hit. Since the buildings hold over 50,000 workers, this was a miracle in itself. How many of the people who were employed at the World Trade Center told the media that they were late for work or they had traffic delays?

"...He was holding up two 110 story buildings so that two-thirds of the workers could get out...He sat down and cried that 19 (people) could have so much hate in their hearts. That they didn't choose Him, but another god that doesn't exist, and now they are lost forever. He sent...(those) best trained

for this disaster and had them save the few that were still alive but unable to help themselves. And then He sent many others to help in anyway they were needed. He still isn't finished though. He holds the loved ones that were left behind in His arms. He comforts them daily. His other children are given the strength to reach out to them and help in any way they can...I believe He will continue to help us in what is to come. He will give the people in charge of this great nation the strength and the wisdom to do the right thing. He would never leave us in our time of need.

"So when anyone asks, 'Where was your God on September 11th,' you can say 'everywhere'! And yes, although this is without a doubt the worst thing I have ever seen in my life, I see God's miracles in every bit of it. I keep praying for those who don't believe in God, every chance I have. I can't imagine going through such a difficult time and not believing in God. Life would be hopeless." (Author Unknown)

There are those people who pessimistically look at tragic events like what happened in Uvalde last week and taunt Christian believers with the question, "Where is your God?" Don't despair, because we are in good company. The psalmist went through these kinds of experiences with unbelieving skeptics: My tears have been my food day and night, while men say to me all day long "Where is your God?" (Psalm 42:3). Even Jesus, while suffering on the cross and while His life was being given as an atoning sacrifice for our sins, was mocked by his accusers: In the same way the chief priests, the teachers of the law and the elders mocked him. " He saved others," they said, "but he can't save himself! He's the King of Israel! Let him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God. Let God rescue him now if he wants him, for he said, 'I am the Son of God" (Matthew 27:41-43).

Where is God in all this trouble? He is at work building up His Kingdom and His people. He is preparing us for that day when evil will forever cease, pure and righteousness will reign eternally. The Apostle Paul understood this truth as he wrote these words, "Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal" (2 Corinthians 4:16-18).



Then pealed the bells more loud and deep: "God is not dead, nor doth he sleep; The wrong shall fail, the right prevail, With peace on earth, good will to men."
