STUMPED ABOUT THE SABBATH? CONSULT A TREE!

One apple! That was it...only one apple. Now, you may think I am referring to the sin of Adam and Eve, but I am not. I am referring to the total number of apples I harvested last fall from my dwarf hybrid apple tree that Cindy and I purchased from Tsugawa's Nursery when we purchased our home seven years ago. I knew something was wrong last spring when our tree began to produce leaves but only produced one blossom. Did I simply miss the other blossoms? Nope. A single apple was all that grew on our tree last year. The prior year, there were an abundance of apples, though most of them were stunted in growth (because I did not adequately thin the fruit during the early summer months).

I did some quick research and discovered that trees will sometimes take a year off, especially if the tree was not properly cared for and thinned in the prior year (guilty as charged!). It seems the apple tree was simply taking a sabbatical rest. It was telling its negligent owner that because of his poor maintenance and inattention, it just was not going to produce and would sit

back in its proverbial recliner and sit it out for the season. Quite simply, our tree badly needed a

Which brings up an important theme - we all need a sabbath rest.

The Sabbath Day is a day set apart by God to worship Him and be reminded of our need to find rest in Him. The Sabbath was established after God finished the creation. It wasn't that, after finishing the work, God was tired and needed to rest. God created the Sabbath as a way of declaring that the work of creation was completed on the sixth day; and the seventh day, since there is not more work to be done, is reserved for 'resting in His rest.'

The Christian Sabbath is on the first day of the week, recognizing that in the resurrection of Jesus and the work of our redemption which occurred on the first day of the week - is complete, and we have entered into His rest. We celebrate and recognize that nothing more needs to be done to secure our salvation, for Christ Himself finished that work completely, dying for us on that

tree and rising on the first day of the week. So, Christian, rest in Him! Too often we will reduce the Sabbath to a list of dos and don'ts, which makes the Sabbath into a legalistic exercise (something we need to do in order to earn His favor). Jesus came to free us from this type of destructive legalism. Instead, we are gifted a day from the Lord so that we might engage in the joys of communing with the Lord and His people is a special way. Guy Prentiss Waters, in his book, The Sabbath as Rest, observes, "Afterall, the Sabbath is a weekly invitation from God to draw close and enter into renewed fellowship with the One who made us and who redeemed

sinners at the loss of His own son. And it is a weekly reminder that in Christ, the best is yet to come."

The Sabbath Day is a day to delight in the Lord. It is not a duty to enter into a sabbath rest; but, it should be a joy. In Isaiah 58, we read of how the Sabbath Day had become a day to take advantage of others in order to please ourselves and our selfish desires. This did not reflect the Lord nor did it honor Him.

God calls the people back to a true Sabbath rest that is a day to observe God's provisions for creation. Then, God exhorts, "If you turn back your foot from the Sabbath, from doing your pleasure on my holy day, and call the Sabbath a delight and the holy day of the LORD honorable; if you honor it, not going your own ways, or seeking your own pleasure, or talking idly;" (Isaiah 58:13, ESV).

Even after years of walking with the Lord, I am still learning about the Sabbath and learning what it means to observe the Sabbath and delight in this special gift from God. How about you? Might you need to rethink your view and observance of the Sabbath rest? As I have discovered, trees have a way of pointing us back to our need to rest in the completed work of the Lord.
