

### ONE LAST THING BEFORE I LEAVE FOR SABBATICAL

Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD, and turn away from evil. It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones.

Proverbs 3:5-8 (ESV).

As I mentioned this past Sunday, I joined in on a webinar that was dedicated to the topic of planning a sabbatical. It seemed a little late to be attending a planning session when I was only a week away from beginning my sabbatical, but as I listened to the presentation, I saw how the Lord has been leading and preparing our church for OUR sabbatical (that's right, this is a sabbatical for the whole church family).

First, I am not taking a sabbatical to take a break from my church family, nor are we discouraged in ministry at WPC. Though Cindy and I will be away from you during this time, it is not because we need a 'time out' from all of you. I know I've tried in the past to express how much Woodland Presbyterian means to us. We came here eight and a half years ago hoping we could experience true community in Christ. Our time here thus far has far exceeded our deepest hopes and dreams. This church family has, for us, become our home, and we hope

to continue here until I enter into the new phase of ministry called retirement. This sabbatical is meant to refresh and enrich all of us so that Cindy and I can continue to offer our gifts in ministry for the coming years.

Second, this sabbatical gives me an opportunity to step away from my usual duties so that I may concentrate on some areas of personal and vocational development that is difficult to do while occupied with full-time ministry. Since the COVID pandemic, I have been exploring the use of liturgy in my personal, daily devotions. This has enriched my prayer life and daily communion with God. I plan to spend much of my sabbatical time developing and cultivating personal liturgical materials that will not only assist me in personal worship of the Lord, but perhaps it will be of help to some in our church family.

The third point – and the most crucial point – is that this is a time

to remember that our hope is always and only in the Lord. Several times during the webinar, the presenters pressed the point that a sabbatical can initially be difficult on both the pastor and the church. There is a crisis that occurs, because we often falsely believe that the church can't function without the pastor. Recently I spoke to a pastor on sabbatical who said that he was having a tough time, because while he had been away, the church ministry was not falling apart, but in fact, the ministry was actually thriving! How many of you remember when the church was without a pastor for three years? Do you remember the prayer gatherings, the congregational meetings, the important discussions about the biblical calling and direction for the church ministry? Do you also remember the blessings of Christ you experienced during the pastoral search as God was providing, blessing, and causing you to grow?

All that provision and growth - and without a pastor! I remember hearing Pastor Jack Hayford once declare that as a pastor, he wanted his congregation to become so mature in Christ that they did not need him anymore, and yet, that he was so cherished within his church family that they could never imagine life without him.

I know that these next few months will fly by quickly. Your elders and deacons will be providing good leadership and care. Wonderful, godly guest preachers will bring the Word of God, and the Holy Spirit will speak clearly through them. We will be challenged in ways yet unseen and unknown. But in this time, The Lord will remind us all that He reigns supreme, and in Him, we will find rest.
