From the Pastor's Desk



In my childhood, there was a standard assignment for elementary students just coming back to school after summer break. You might recall this exercise writing a short essay entitled "What I did on Summer vacation." This is my "What I did on Sabbatical" essay. Two months away from the church and three months out of the pulpit is a long time. I praise God for providing such capable and godly preachers who filled the pulpit during my absence, and I thank the Lord for a congregation that welcomed them with open arms (and welcomed me back also).

What was I doing during my time away? There are many types of pastoral sabbaticals - some are purely for rest, some are primarily for study, and still others are for an extended time to spend with family apart from the daily demands of vocational ministry. Usually, however, a sabbatical involves a combination of all three and more. I would put my sabbatical in the latter category.

In August and September, I had the opportunity to relax and rest, spending extended time with family and friends. Cindy was able to join me - that is, when she was not working.

I began my sabbatical spending precious time with my oldest brother, Don, and his wife, Jan nearly two weeks (and they didn't throw me out). I stayed in their home in Wenatchee, enjoying their hospitality, great moments of conversation, and times of prayer. I also enjoyed worshiping with EPC brothers and sisters at Saddleback Presbyterian Church.

After leaving Wenatchee, I traveled down to Prosser, WA to spend a few days with two special friends from college. It was truly a blessing to spend some time with my dear friends, sharing stories and marveling at the Lord's faithfulness through the years.

I was also able to spend a week with my brother, Bob, and his wife, Kathleen, who live in Mukilteo. Cindy was able to join me for a few days; and then, after she left, to travel back to Woodland. I stayed several more days with Bob and Kathy, as I enjoyed many relaxing conversations on their deck that overlooks the Puget Sound.

I returned home for a week spending time in the library and at McDonald's reading books on worship and working on my sabbatical project.

Then the time finally came for Cindy and me to fly to Greece and Rome and tour some of the sites where the Apostle Paul traveled on his mission journeys. This was a trip we had been planning for two years, and I must admit, it lived up to our expectations and more. We enjoyed getting to know others on the tour and saw such amazing sites. For a discount on the tour, I agreed to lead some bus and site devotions, which was a wonderful privilege. We came home with great memories, a few souvenirs, and some facts and stories that will aid me in my future preaching and teaching.

Finally, the last week in September, we traveled to New Hampshire to attend a wedding, visit family and friends, and enjoy peak of the fall foliage for which New England is so famous. Upon our return from New England, I was back in the office and resuming most of my pastoral responsibilities.

In this time away, Cindy and I enjoyed attending other churches in this area, having a chance to see the way others worshipped the Lord and enjoying the fellowship of the wider Church.

My sabbatical was also a rare opportunity for me to dedicate a good block of time to work on daily devotional material. I realized something during my personal study: In the last few years, I've become such a liturgy geek. The word, "liturgy" comes from a Greek word that simply means, "worship." A liturgy is a guide used for worship, whether it refers to the order of worship we use on Sunday or the order of worship for daily worship. Shortly after the COVID pandemic, I began to use a daily liturgy by Jonathan Gibson titled, Be Thou My Vision. It is based on liturgies developed by the Protestant Reformers and was written to provide Christians a form or guide for daily worship and prayer. Ever since adopting that liturgy, my walk with the Lord has changed dramatically. God has used this devotional liturgy to draw me closer to Him with a consistency and intensity that for so many years had escaped me. Initially, I was only using Gibson's liturgy, repeating the 31-day cycle over month after month. I decided that if/when I took a sabbatical leave, I would attempt to write a personal 31-day liturgy for daily devotions. For a majority of these last three months, my morning routine has been to go to a library or coffee shop and spend three to four hours of research, reading, and writing. I sought out prayers of the church fathers and reformers, chose Bible passages that supported the various components of the daily order of worship (i.e, Adoration, Confession, and Pardon, Daily Bible Readings, etc.), and began to develop the daily liturgy. I completed the project and enjoyed teaching a class in October, explaining the value of using a daily liturgy for personal devotions and handing out this liturgy to those who attended the class. This liturgy is readily available to all who would like to try using a daily liturgy. We will also soon be putting the class videos on our church website for anyone who would like to learn more about the history and use of a daily liturgy.

Thank you, Church family, for giving me this opportunity to take time away from the church to rest, reflection, and restoration. I pray and trust that the benefits of a sabbatical leave will become clear to you - even if you may still be a bit skeptical and think that I was just taking a long vacation. Regardless of how you feel about sabbaticals, please know that Cindy and I were unbelievably blessed and are so very grateful to you for all the prayers and support you offered while we were away. Oh, and did I mention how good it is to be back?


