"Precious Lord, Take My Hand"

Thomas Dorsey, a jazz musician from Atlanta, made a bold decision in 1926 to leave behind secular music and devote his talent to writing songs for the Lord. But following that call wasn't easy. During the Great Depression, many church leaders criticized his soulful gospel style, calling it "the devil's music." Dorsey later joked, "I got kicked out of some of the best churches in the land." Then, in 1932, tragedy struck. While in St. Louis for a revival, he received a telegram that his wife had died suddenly during childbirth. His faith was shaken to the core, and grief nearly silenced him. Yet in his deepest sorrow, Dorsey turned back to what he knew best — music. Out of that heartbreak came one of the most beloved hymns of all time: "Precious Lord, take my hand, Lead me on, let me stand. I am tired, I am weak, I am worn..." Dorsey's song reminds us that even in our valleys, God is near — guiding us, strengthening us, and using our pain to

Sunday Morning Live (Adult Sunday School)

After a brief hiatus, beginning on Sunday, January 11, 9 a.m., we will restart Sunday Morning Live (Adult Sunday School), in the Glass Chapel. We will be studying a two-DVD series titled "The 7 Churches of Revelation -Times of Fire" and "The 7 Churches of Revelation - Part II - Times Of Deception."

Many Christians believe we are living in the "Last Days." In the book of Revelation, the hostile times preceding the return of Christ are vividly described. We wonder, could it be soon? This study examines the letters from the resurrected Christ given to the last living Apostle John, for the seven Churches in Asia Minor (Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicea).

Investigative filmmaker Christophe Hanauer travels to present-day Turkey, where the seven Churches are located, to uncover the secrets of these prophetic letters. He uncovers many clues to the daily hardships of these 1st Century churches. His discoveries from the archaeological sites reveal, among other things, that Christianity had spread like wildfire across the Roman Empire, challenging ancient pagan worship and the order established by Imperial Rome. The Roman Emperor was intent on stopping it, persecuting anyone who rejected his claim to deity.

In this study, a group of scholars and theologians provide historic and cultural insights with which we can begin to see connections to our modern world. Within these mysterious letters, we find keys to the heart of God for His Bride. Are our hearts prepared for His return? Is today's Church ready for these times of fire?

Some believe the book of Revelation was only for the time of early Christians. But, others believe Christ's message to the seven Churches is timeless. Do you have questions about the book of Revelation? If so, you are not alone. Come and join us Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m. for this amazing journey.

extreme, we may be in need of

Years ago, when I was serving a church in New York State, I met a man who was a very accomplished musician. Technically, he was flawless. He could play any piece that you placed before him with amazing exactness. And though one would be in awe of his talent, there seemed to be something missing whenever he performed. Call it what you will - heart, soul, feeling - he just did not project any kind of passion or emotion in his performance. He was as steady and a rock and could be counted on to reproduce the musical piece as written, but he just was not capable of communicating anything besides what was written on the page. He played with precision, but lacked passion.

Presbyterians, for better or for worse, are often known for their expertise in doctrine and polity. Many of my colleagues in the EPC are very impressive when it comes to their mastery of biblical theology – which is a very good thing. The danger with knowledge, however, is that it can lead one to become puffed up with pride. On the other side, there are denominations that might be more known for their enthusiasm in worship and evangelism rather than biblical knowledge and doctrinal purity. If we find ourselves on either

serious correction. The church in Ephesus is a prime example. We read about them in Revelation 2:

² "I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance, and how you cannot bear with those who are evil, but have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false.

³ I know you are enduring patiently and

³ I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for my name's sake, and you have not grown weary. ⁴ But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the

love you had at first. 5 Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. Rev. 2:2-5 (ESV)

Jesus commends the church for their biblical doctrine and refusal to compromise when it comes to God's Word. However, they failed to live out those important truths in their day to day lives.

This is my concern when it comes to the Church and our church (and my life). I desire to see our church family grow in the knowledge of God and of His word (this is desperately lacking in our society today as recent studies have shown). However, I fear that we can place so much emphasis in knowing the right things (orthodoxy - right beliefs) that we neglect living right things out (orthopraxy - right practice/living). That was Paul's concern for Timothy as he encourages him to watch himself (his life) and the teaching (doctrine). Personally, this has been the primary reason that I have been exploring and developing a more consistent prayer/devotional life.

I don't want to become a "one-trick pony" pastor, but I will, without apology, continue to encourage you (my church family) to develop a system for daily devotions that works for you (and you can continue to encourage me as well). A devotional life that emphasizes the Holy Scriptures and sound teaching, and at the same time, also incorporates issues of the heart - the joyous living out of sound biblical knowledge and doctrine - that is the goal. My desire for our church family is that we continue to develop into followers of Jesus who serve our Lord with precision and passion - to His glory and for our enjoyment!
