a waterway by the lush, green growth that marks the winding path of the river.

As my brother, Don, and I sat on his back porch, we gazed out over of the brown hills of Wenatchee, deep in a spiritual conversation. It occurred to me later that our discussion really did match the environment of Eastern Washington. We were talking about the need for Christians to draw closer to the Lord in these days when our society is trying to convince us to abandon faith for more 'reasonable and pleasurable' pursuits. A culture that seems to be trading in the truth of God in exchange for "whatever seems best in your own eyes" – a lifestyle based on our own personal, debased preferences. The end of these kind of worldly pursuits always winds up in the same place – far away from the streams of living water and devoid of abundant life.

Perhaps David was moved by this kind of geographical "contrast" between the barren hillside and fertile river vale when he penned these words in Psalm 63:1-4 (ESV): ***1 O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water. 2 So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. 3 Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. 4 So I will bless you as long as I live; in your name I will lift up my hands.*** 'A dry and weary land where there is no water' is an apt description of the barrenness of life apart from God. We don't always see this truth or grasp our need to earnestly seek the Lord in our lives. There are times when we may go days without seeking the Lord and communing with Him in prayer and in His Word. When that happens, we become very susceptible to the dangers of the harsh environment of this world. We can easily be

Rocky, barren, brown hills that seem to envelop you as you come out of the pass and make your way into Wenatchee. swayed by the unfruitful terrain of godless philosophies that may seem to have great potential for a fruitful life but always ends up dry and lifeless.

When commenting on Psalm 63, Dane C. Ortlund, in his devotional, *In the Lord I Take Refuge*, gives us this reminder: *You were made for God. The heart of Christianity is not a set of doctrines to believe, even though sound doctrine is vital. Nor is the heart of Christianity an activity to pursue, even though the Christian faith is necessarily active. Nor is it essentially a set of disciplines, even though without reading the Bible and praying we will not get far in the Christian life. The heart of Christianity is— to use a phrase from John Bunyan, the old Puritan preacher and writer—“ to live upon God.” You were made for God. To know him. Enjoy him. Revere him. Draw strength from him. Trust him. Love him.*

Maybe you feel as if you are wandering in a spiritual desert wasteland right now. From time to time, we all end up in this dry, weary, and waterless land. But the Lord calls us back to the waters and to the place of refreshing. Why wait? Go there and find life!

From her July 2022 Letter...

God blessed our ten days of prayer of May 26-June 4 (Ascension to Pentecost). We were praying, among other things, for Revival.

The dedication of the Me'en New Testament was a time of great joy. Matt included this photo of people lined up to buy New Testaments and others reading them. They estimate that more than half of the printed copies sold at the dedication. The people were already reading the Scriptures in their heart language, because a few copies of one New Testament book at a time had been made available by "Print on Demand."



Matt also built an App for the audio text so people can listen to it on their mobile phones.

Praise God that Matt and the Tsara translation team have completed the consultant check of Matthew through 2 Corinthians as well as four short epistles. Please continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal truth to the translators and other professing Christians so that they truly understand the Gospel and apply it in their daily lives.

Matt is currently taking a 6-week course in typesetting, something he has wanted to do since we had so many challenges with the typesetting of the Kafa Bible. He is enjoying the course. Sadly, it means he won't be able to help with the Pastors' Training Course in Kafa the last week of July, but others from Wycliffe Ethiopia will do that. Please pray that those who take the course will become fluent readers of the Kafa Scriptures and will read them to their congregations and preach from them. When one has never read aloud in his mother tongue, it takes some practice to do so fluently.
