

HIGH PRIEST

²⁹ "Whenever Aaron enters the Holy Place, he will bear the names of the sons of Israel over his heart on the breastpiece of decision as a continuing memorial before the LORD. ³⁰ Also put the Urim and the Thummim in the breastpiece, so they may be over Aaron's heart whenever he enters the presence of the LORD. Thus Aaron will always bear the means of making decisions for the Israelites over his heart before the LORD. Exodus 28:29-30 (NIV)

Perhaps you spent time watching the summer Olympic Games. One of the highlights of the games is watching the opening ceremony and seeing the select athletes of Team USA carrying in the flag of our country. It is a high and weighty honor as they carry the flag that not only represents them personally and their fellow teammates, but that flag they carry represents all the citizens of the United States of America. In a sense, they carry the names of all the people of our country into the competition.

As Cindy and I have been reading through Exodus this past week, we came to the instructions that the Lord gives to the Israelites concerning the creation of the garments that Aaron, the high priest, was to wear as he as he entered the Holy Place to minister before God.

Because we are also studying the Letter to the Hebrews in our Bible study class, I am understanding the instructions to Moses and Aaron very differently, being reminded that the instructions God gave to Moses concerning worship in the tabernacle/temple was only a copy/model of the true worship that

takes place in the true and heavenly Temple of God. Christ, who is the superior and perfect High Priest, perfectly represents us, bearing the names of His people before the Father in the heavenly Temple, making it possible for us to enter into the very presence of our most holy God.

With this in mind, read again the opening verses in this article from Exodus 28. Can you see how the ephod and breastplate Aaron was given foreshadows the perfect Breastplate of Righteousness that Jesus wears before the Father in the most holy place. Notice the purpose for which Aaron was to wear that breastplate over his heart. He bore the names of God's people as he entered the Holy of holies, representing the twelve tribes of Israel in the presence of the Lord. That is so significant when you think about what Jesus, our true High Priest, does for us as He sits at the right hand of the Father in glory. In His pure righteousness, He is able to approach His Father, and He does so on our behalf. In the truest sense, our names are included on His Breastplate of Righteousness and

Jesus continually bears our names over His heart. Hebrews 10:19-22 describes how through Jesus - the One who bears the names of His people - we enter into the presence of God: 19 Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, 20 by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, 21 and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. (NIV)

The Westminster Larger Catechism speaks of this ministry of intercession that Jesus provides for all those who trust in Him:

Q. 55. How does Christ intercede?
A. Christ intercedes by continually appearing in our human nature before the Father in heaven. There he makes his will clear that his own merit of obedience and sacrifice on earth be applied to all believers; he answers all the accusations against believers and makes sure they have peace of conscience, in spite of their daily failings;

and he welcomes them without hesitation to the throne of grace and accepts who they are and what they do for him.

Next time you go before the throne of grace in prayer, take a moment to recall our Great High Priest, Jesus, the One who has opened the way for us to come into God's presence and the One who bears the names of His people – our names – continually before the Father. HeartCry Missionary Society

The goal of the HeartCry Missionary Society is to glorify God and bring the greatest possible good to humankind through the preaching of the gospel and the establishment of biblical churches throughout the world by means of equipping and mobilizing indigenous churches and missionaries, especially in areas that have little or no gospel presence. Indigenous missionaries are those who are native to their country and culture. They do not have to learn a foreign language or the nuances of the culture. As a result, they can be much more effective and much more quickly than non-indigenous missionaries. The goal of Heartcry is also that God's name would be great among the nations, and that all people from all people groups will come to worship Him, and this will be accomplished as the Great Commission is fulfilled. In addition, Heartcry has the goal to plant biblical churches that will proclaim God's Word throughout the world. Most of the missionaries in the world go to areas that are already reached. The need is critical and urgent to have indigenous missionaries go to these unreached people groups. Pray for the Heartcry Missionary Society, and pray that all peoples of the world will have the opportunity to hear the glorious news of the gospel.

EPC Presbytery of the Pacific Northwest Report (EPCPNW) – January 31, 2025

Last week, Jason Wolk, Steve Wallace, and Kevin Leach represented our church at the 22nd stated meeting of the EPCPNW gathering at New Hope Presbyterian Church in Kent, WA. Cindy Leach and Cindy Wallace also attended as observers, and Sally Hager was present, as she serves as the chair of the Session Review Committee.

We arrived on Thursday to participate in the Missions Workshop where we heard reports concerning the ongoing work of EPC World Outreach. Did you know that there are currently 14 million people from unreached people groups residing in the U.S.(mostly refugees)? What an opportunity we have right here in our backyard to spread the Gospel to those people who up to this time, have had little or no exposure to the Good News of Jesus. Thursday evening, Cindy Leach led the women's link discussion on the various discipling ministries currently offered within our churches and encouraged the churches in our presbytery to be involved in women's discipleship.

Our business meeting took place on Friday. Throughout the day, we had several opportunities to worship, pray, and conduct our necessary business. We did not have any ordination exams on the docket at this meeting, but we did examine and vote to receive two candidates into the care of the presbytery, as they begin a process that, by God's grace and guidance, will lead to ordination. Praise the Lord that there seems to be a positive upward trend of young men and women training for ministry within the EPC.

We ended our time with a communion service on Friday evening, communing with Christ and one another in song, word, prayer, and sacrament.
