SABBATICAL LEAVE

8 "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. 9 Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, 10 but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates.

11 For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

Exodus 20:8-11 (ESV)

To begin with, Thank you, church family. In a month I will begin a sabbatical leave which has been in the planning stages for two years now. In December 2023, as Cindy and I celebrated our seventh year of ministry at Woodland Presbyterian Church, the elders and I began to discuss a sabbatical leave. The session drew up a proposal for a Lilly sabbatical grant, which was submitted in March of 2024. Unfortunately, we did not receive the grant. Rather than postponing my sabbatical leave another year to pursue the grant in 2025, the session decided that it would be more beneficial to take a sabbatical leave in 2025. My sabbatical will take place in August and September. Thank you for your prayers and grace.

Just what is a sabbatical? Is it an extended vacation? It is a study leave? Why is it necessary? Those are all good questions, and you may have even more questions concerning my time on Sabbatical.

A sabbatical leave is an extended time away from daily church ministry to enjoy a time of rest, renewal, and an opportunity to pursue spiritual development that will enhance my spiritual growth and prepare me for ministry in the future. Typically, a sabbatical in ministry is to occur every seven years; but practically, it happens a few times in the span of one's ministry career. My last sabbatical leave was in 1998. Practically, what does my leave mean to you, my special church family. Your elders have arranged for the pulpit to be filled in my absence. The ruling elders will be available to minister to your needs, and we are making arrangements for local pastors to assist our church family if/when significant pastoral needs arise.

What will I be doing while away from daily ministry responsibilities? Our original sabbatical proposal to the Lilly Foundation was entitled, "Daily Rhythms in our Journey of Sanctification." This theme, in part, was chosen, because I have a growing desire to develop a personal daily liturgy for prayer and devotions. This time away from the daily routine of ministry will give me opportunity to focus on and develop this material, which I hope will not only refresh my soul, but will be beneficial to all of you as well. When I return in October, I will not resume preaching duties until the fourth Sunday. The first three Sundays in October, I will be sharing the results of my devotional project with the congregation during the Sunday school hour. Perhaps you have an established daily rhythm of devotion and prayer, or maybe you have thought about it, but have not yet incorporated a rhythm of devotion into your daily routine. My hope is that we all will benefit from what I learn and develop while on sabbatical.

While I am away, I will be spending extended time with family and friends while I work on this devotional material. Cindy and I will be worshipping at churches near and far, savoring a season of special spiritual nourishment.

The other activity that Cindy and I are looking forward to is a trip to Greece and Rome, following the footsteps of Paul. This will be a 12-day tour that will not only be a trip of a lifetime for us, but will also prepare me to bring back fresh insights for my preaching and teaching ministry in the coming years at WPC.

Again, thank you for this privilege, and do not by shy to approach me with any concerns or questions you might have as Cindy and I prepare for our sabbatical leave.
